It is often during my morning walk that something surprising happens, whether it is the sudden appearance of two young coyotes resting near the pathway, the enchanting hoot of an owl, the sight of a falcon resting on a branch, or an unexpected array of gardenia blossoms in November. The other day, the autumn mist had settled over the trees in the village, some areas almost like a fog, and other areas a dreamy gray growing thicker into the distance. The vegetation close to me was clear, but as I came to a rise in the road and could see into the distance, the further I looked, the trees and buildings were less clear.

We know that many people expected this kingdom to be one in which Israel would once again be a strong force in the world, a material kingdom with the Messiah as the ruler. This was definitely true at the time of Jesus, the Christ, and try as he would, he had a difficult time convincing people, even his disciples, that his kingdom was not "of this world," but was a kingdom of love to be developed in the hearts of humanity. They had a difficult time realizing that the love and power of God had already been placed within them and that the ministry of Jesus was to call forth this love and peace.

It seems that very few in the world have ever been able to see and understand God's ultimate plan of love and peace in the world. There seems to be a fog or mist that prevents us from understanding fully what God has planned for us as individuals and for the world.





Advent Sermon Themes

November 30th – People of Hope: Jeremiah 29:11-14; Luke 2:25-32

As we light the first Advent candle, the Candle of Hope, we remember the hope expressed by the prophets Isaiah and Jeremiah, who anticipated the coming of the Messiah and the restoration of Israel. The message of the prophets was both a call to righteousness and a reminder that God is always bringing new life and possibilities. In Luke's Gospel, we have the testimony of three older people: Zechariah, Elizabeth, and Simeon. All three of these held on with hope and witnessed the incarnation of God and the birth of Jesus.

December 7th – People of Peace: Isaiah 9:6-7, 26:1-3; Micah 4:3-4; Luke 2:8-14; John 14:27

There are messages of peace and promises of peace throughout the Bible, the Old and New Testaments. Many of the prophets spoke in literal and poetic form about the coming of peace, and it was Isaiah who foretold the coming of the Prince of Peace. It was the angels who brought "good news of great joy to all the people," and then were joined by a "multitude of the heavenly host" who included in their song of praise: "Peace among those he favors." We are challenged in these times of war and division to not only speak peace, but to be the peace that God would intend for the world.

December 14th – People of Love: Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-31

In these scriptures, we have separate stories of Joseph and Mary, how each was visited by an angel, Joseph in a dream and Mary by the angel Gabriel. In their love of God and in obedience to what was commanded them, they followed the instructions given them. In these passages, we find ourselves challenged to live the life of love and obedience to God. This life of love often comes with unexpected direction and challenges, as it did for Joseph and Mary. We wonder if and how God is directing us today in this world of anger and hate to be obedient to the life of love.

December 21st – People of Joy – Christmas Cantata: Christmas in story and song. Psalm 16:7-9; John 15:7-11

The message of Joy for all of the world is promised in many of the writings and pronouncements of the prophets, and this joy is for everyone. Do we remember that when we sing one of our favorite Christmas Carols that we are singing "Joy to the WORLD, the Lord has come"? On this final Sunday of Advent, the choir is bringing the message of joy, joined by a small orchestra, through the beautiful music written by Joel Raney, who has used familiar carols and themes in new and exciting ways. The story and song concludes with the congregation joining in the singing of three familiar Christmas Carols. Please invite friends and acquaintances to this special service.

December 24th – Christmas Eve Candlelight Service – 4 pm

This special service includes the great music that welcomes the birth of the child, a reflection by Pastor David, the lighting of the Christ candle, and a time to humbly reflect on the meaning of Christ coming into our world and our lives.

December 28th – Christmastide: Matthew 2:7-15

God's faithful servant, Meg Estrada, will be leading the worship service and bringing the morning message, "Is That All?" She has designed an inspiring service that includes a reflection on the coming of the "wise men – magi" to visit the Christ child, bridging the gap between Christmas and Epiphany, which occurs on January 6th.



Ashleigh Kelly, Administrator

Pastor David: Tell me about where you come from and your family.

Ashleigh: I was born in La Mirada, CA, and we lived in Whitter until I was 4, when the Whitter Earthquake moved our house off its foundation. That was my first memory, "surfing on my bed." We moved to Laguna Niguel. My mother's grandmother immigrated from Holland. Both of my parents were born in California, and I have one sister, eight years younger than I. I would say my childhood was fantastic. "I won the lottery with my parents."

I sometimes say, "I was raised by Methodist hippies, open, liberal." They were intentional about raising independent children. I went to several colleges, with a degree in media arts, and actually had my first job in graphic design when I was fourteen. Most of the people know my youngest son, Bray, who has been with me in the church office since he was born 4 years ago. My daughter, Sadie, is a Freshman at the University of Idaho, Chandler, 15, is a Sophomore in High School, and Dermott, 10, is in the fifth grade.

Pastor David: Besides graphic design, where have you worked?

Ashleigh: I worked in retail, then as a server and bartender, and at age 21 started my church career at La Habra UMC as a youth director, a position I have had in several churches. I had been backpacking through Europe, ran out of money. My parents told me I had a job as a youth minister and brought me home. My parents became United Methodists when I was in second grade. My best friend and I had gotten "in trouble," and her father was a UMC pastor. The two sets of parents became best friends. I am now working part-time as the Youth Director at Aldersgate UMC in Tustin.

Pastor David: What is your history with Laguna Country UMC?

Ashleigh: I was a member at Sea Country UMC when that church merged with Laguna Hills UMC and became Laguna Country UMC. I was in the eighth grade. Terri Lancey had been my Sunday School teacher at Sea Country UMC.

Pastor David: What are your basic duties as Church Administrator at LCUMC?

Ashleigh: I used to say, "I do everything but preach." I came to work here in 2018 and am responsible for all print work, graphics, and email publications: bulletin, Viewpoint, Current Happenings, marketing for the church, posters, and publicity. I manage the purchasing, billing, reimbursements, contractors, and vendors. I coordinate the use of our facilities and scheduling. I keep membership attendance and records, attend a variety of committee meetings, and see that food is available when needed. I am the first contact in the church office, supporting various programs and administrative committees. I receive the comments, concerns, compliments, and grievances of members.

Pastor David: What do you like about your job?

Ashleigh: I love the people. I am a "total people person." I love this congregation. People are loving, open, and willing to do what it takes to build the church. It feels like the church is waking up.

Pastor David: What do you find challenging?

Ashleigh: I have lots of ideas, but I find it hard to find time to implement them. I have been working in churches for a long time and have experienced so much.

Pastor David: A favorite Bible verse or song?

Ashleigh: My favorite Praise Song is "You Make Beautiful Things" (out of us, out of dust) by Gungor. It is tattooed on my foot.

Pastor David: A word for the church?

Ashleigh: I want the congregation to know that they are so incredible, so capable, and do more, even at their age, than members in most churches.

With Pastor David Atkins' support, I stepped into this role, and together we moved forward.

In February, we began two mission efforts: Centro 32 and Salavision. Centro 32, a nonprofit in Tijuana, received 10 to 12 boxes of food and towels, which were brought to Park Hill UMC in Chula Vista. Rev. Joey Hortiales warmly welcomed the donations. Scott, thank you for making that long drive with me.

At the same time, we supported Salavision, which assists asylum seekers and migrants who had been detained and had items like shoelaces taken for safety reasons. We collected shoelaces, clothes, and shoes, filling a large box that I mailed myself.

After a short break, we resumed with supplies for Sherman Indian School in Riverside. From June to mid-August, we gathered backpacks, school supplies, towels, ramen, peanut butter, and snacks. With your generosity, we assembled 14 boxes and delivered them to the Native American UMC in Anaheim. Thank you to Don for joining me on that trip.

In September, many of us joined four other churches at Santa Ana UMC for the Rise Against Hunger event. Together, we packaged more than 40,000 meals for the Philippines, finishing in under two hours. It was a meaningful time of working side by side.

This November, we collected oatmeal, rice, and beans for Centro 32 once again. Despite a shorter deadline, your quick response filled six boxes, which Scott and I delivered to University UMC in Irvine.

So far this year, we've completed four donation projects and the Rise Against Hunger event. We will close the year with our Angel Tree, gathering gift cards for Western Youth Services.

Thank you to everyone who contributed food, clothing, supplies, and encouragement. I may guide the work, but it is your generosity that makes our missions possible. Each of you plays a part, and I am grateful for every effort. More mission opportunities are ahead. Thank you again, and God bless.
