It may seem like a small thing, but to a boy nine or ten years-of-age, it was big. My dad, the pastor of our small church in rural Oregon, often took me on his visits to members of our church. We had traveled out to the farm of Bill Stuber and I was admiring his collection of rocks. I was particularly taken with a piece of obsidian with brown streaks in it. He handed it to me to feel the smooth sides and sharp edges of this volcanic glass. It felt wonderful, almost magical in my hands. He asked me if I would like to have it. Believe it or not I was very shy at the time and I probably looked up at my dad to see if it was okay to accept this precious stone. It was acceptable. That was the first time I remember the generosity of someone outside my family. I have kept that rock for over seventy years. The internet says it is worth about \$15. It is worth a lot more than that to me. It is a treasure. It is a symbol of generosity. I was taught by my parents to be generous. This generosity included giving of my talents, giving of my time, giving of my energy, and it also included giving of my financial resources. Sometimes I wonder if the financial security that Sherry and I experience now is due to that spirit of generosity. Paul lists this as one of the fruits of the spirit (Galatians 5:22) There are so many scriptures about the generosity of God to us, God's children. And then there is that powerful statement in Luke 6:38: "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over..." Today I give thanks to God who lavishes love and blessings on us. Today I give thanks for those who have been generous to me both in love and materially. Today I give thanks for the opportunity to be generous to others.

How We Got Our Bible

OCTOBER 4 & 5, 2025

The purpose of the event is to help our Laguna Woods Community explore the history of the Bible in new and deeper ways - raising practical questions and introducing insights they may not have considered before.

Who: Dr. Lee McDonald, respected biblical scholar and author, will lead the weekend. Attendees will include members of Laguna Country UMC and guests from the surrounding community. Registration is open to the community (\$15.00 donation includes lunch - limited scholarships are available)

What: A weekend of learning and faith exploration, focused on how the Bible was formed, why certain texts were included or excluded, and how early Christian and Jewish traditions shaped what we read today. Saturday's format includes lecture-style presentations with time for questions. Dr. McDonald will also speak at the Sunday service of worship at 9:30 a.m.

Where: Laguna Country United Methodist Church (Church Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall)

When: A Saturday - Sunday event on October 4 & 5, 2025
9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Saturday 9:30 a.m. Sunday

Why: To offer a thoughtful opportunity to engage with Scripture in a deeper and more informed way — bridging the gap between personal faith and historical context. The series invites reflection on how the Bible came to be, how we interpret it today, and what this means for our shared life of faith.

How: Dr. McDonald will focused his engaging lectures around key questions about the history of the Bible. There will be Q & A sessions in the morning and afternoon programs. Dr. McDonald will be speaking in the Sunday morning sermon to conclude the weekend.




Sermon Themes

September 7th - “It’s About Relationships”

Philemon 1-3, 8-16; Luke 14:25-33

In Paul's brief letter to Philemon, he is pleading that Philemon welcome back Onesimus who was a slave who has possibly run away and has come to serve Paul while he is in prison. He is appealing to Philemon's forgiveness of Onesimus, who Paul believes has changed and can be useful now. Jesus gives the great challenge that to be his disciple one must be willing to give up everything, all of one's possessions, carry the cross, and follow faithfully.

September 14th - “I Found It! Rejoice With Me!”

1 Timothy 1:12-17; Luke 15:1-10

Paul writes about the mercy and grace of God and his faith and love in Christ Jesus because of the forgiveness he has received. He calls himself a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence before his conversion. Luke tells us how Jesus is criticized for welcoming sinners and eating with them. He responds by telling two parables in chapter 15, one of the lost sheep and the other of the lost coin and how much rejoicing comes as a result, comparing that to God's joy when one sinner repents.

September 21st - “Whatever it takes”

1 Timothy 2:1-7; Luke 16:1-13

We are invited, encouraged by Paul to pray for everyone, even for kings and people in high places since God's desire is for everyone to be saved. He includes the power statement that there is one God and Christ Jesus gave himself “a ransom for all.” Jesus gives a surprising parable about a shrewd but dishonest manager who is commended by his master, then admonishes the followers to be faithful in whatever they are given.

September 28th- “Living with Generosity”

1 Timothy 6:6-10, 17-19, Luke 16:19-31

Paul gives a strong statement about living in a state of generosity, aware that it is God who provides for us. Paul does not condemn the wealthy person, but entreats Timothy to instruct those with wealth to “be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share.” Jesus tells the parable of the rich man and poor Lazarus who ate crumbs that fell from the rich man's table and what happens to each when they die.






Adult Classes On Early Methodism

Sunday, October 5th – Early Methodism in America



The Prayer Shawl Ministry

Shawl (shol)n.: A square or oblong piece of cloth worn as a covering for the head, neck, and shoulders. (earlier: shal, shaul, from Urdu, Persian)

"Shawls...made for centuries universal and embracing, symbolic of an inclusive, unconditionally loving, God. they wrap, enfold, comfort, cover, give solace, mother, hug, shelter and beautify.

Those who have received these shawls have been uplifted and affirmed, as if given wings to fly above their troubles..."

In 1998, Janet Bristow and Victoria Galo began the ministry. Care and the love of knitting have been combined into a prayerful ministry that reaches out to those in need of comfort and solace. Many blessings are *knitted into every shawl. (*The shawls can also be crocheted, woven, or quilted) Whether they are called "Prayer Shawls", "Comfort Shawls", "Peace Shawls", or "Mantles", the creator begins each shawl with prayers and blessings for the recipient. Intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl. When the shawl is completed, it is offered a final blessing by the group or congregation before being sent on its way. Some recipients have continued the kindness by making one themselves and passing it on to someone in need. Thus, the blessing is rippled from person to person with both the giver and receiver feeling the unconditional embrace of a sheltering, mothering God!


