Pastor David's Reflections

It came in a box with directions on how to assemble it. Each step was numbered. There was a drawing for each step. I followed the directions. It went together nicely and easily. Oh, there was a time when I thought I could figure out how to assemble furniture on my own. After all, I am an intelligent person. That was many years ago, and I learned the hard way, because not following directions, step by step, meant I had to disassemble much of the desk I had been putting together back then and start from the beginning. In fact, I learned that once a manufactured piece of furniture is assembled, it is hard to take it apart without damaging it. Remember the saying, "If all else fails, follow the directions." Last Sunday our Gospel reading was from Luke 11:1-13 where Jesus gives instructions on how to pray. The disciples noticed that he had been praying, as he often did, and one of them said, "Lord, teach us to pray." So he did. Luke's version of The Lord's Prayer (which I believe should be called The Disciple's Prayer) is very simple and has five parts. I would suggest that Jesus gives us a basic formula we can use when we pray: 1 - "Father" - A CLOSE RELATIONSHIP. The actual Greek word is "ABBA:" which in English translates as "Daddy", suggesting an intimate connection. 2 - "Thy kingdom come." SURRENDER to the will of God in all things. 3 - "Give us each day our daily bread." TRUST that God will give us what we need for that particular day. 4 - "Forgive us our sins." HUMILITY in the awareness that we stray from the path. 5 - "Lead us not into temptation." GUIDANCE from God throughout the day. Jesus gave us directions on how to pray. These are the five steps: Have a CLOSE RELATIONSHIP with God, SURRENDER to God's will, TRUST in God, maintain HUMILITY because we stray, and ask for GUIDANCE. I invite you to use this formula in your daily prayers and in your walk with Christ.

The prayer team meets every Tuesday at 10:00 am at Joy's home.


We also have a Prayer Tree, where we pass the prayer along to the others by phone.



Sermon Themes

August 3rd Hebrews 11:1-3; Luke 12:32-40 - FAITH AND ACTION: The writer of the Hebrew letter provides a litany of those who have lived by faith: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Sarah. However, he asserts that they did not live to find the homeland for which they longed. Jesus, in Luke, calls us into alertness and action, to focus on treasures in heaven, reminding us that “where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” It is an admonition to keep your lights lit and ready for the presence of Christ.

August 10th- Colossians 3:1-11; Luke 12:13-21 - A DIFFERENT MINDSET: Paul indicates that we have a choice. We can either focus our minds on “the things that are above,” or on “things that are on earth.” It is quite a challenge for us to focus on the spiritual aspects of life when we are so involved in the matters of the earth - daily concerns, financial needs, tasks at hand. In Luke we have Jesus warning against greed and the false security of material wealth. Jesus invites us to not focus on earthly treasures but to be “rich toward God.”

August 17th- Hebrews 11:29-12:2 - RUN WITH PERSEVERANCE: We continue the Hebrew writers list of those who have been faithful to their calling. He lists both men and women who have persevered through all kinds of trials and persecutions, giving great details of what they endured. Then he reminds the reader that since we have all these witnesses to the faith, we too are to persevere as we look to Jesus, the “Pioneer and perfecter of faith.” We are not expected to blaze a new trail, but to follow the trail already created for us.

August 24th- Jeremiah 4:1-10; Luke 13:10-17 - ACCEPTING THE CHALLENGE: Jeremiah relates how he was called by God to be a “prophet to the nations.” God does not accept the excuses he makes, but empowers him to tackle the tasks given to him. Included in this passage is the beautiful statement: “Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you.” Jeremiah accepts the challenge, as did Jesus, even though he was accosted by the leader of the synagogue, indignant that Jesus dared to heal on the sabbath. This reminds us that the sabbath was made for man, not man for the sabbath.

August 31st- Hebrews 13:1-8; Luke 14:1,7-14 - HUMBLE SERVICE: A lesson on humble empathy is given by the Hebrew writer. It is a challenge to go beyond what is natural and consider the suffering of others. He gives a reminder of the help and protection we receive from God as we do good and share what we have. Luke continues the admonition of humility, generosity, and a welcoming love and promises a reward “at the resurrection of the righteous.”

What's Going On

The Sacristy: Due to water and fire damage, a total rebuild of the Sacristy (where communion is prepared by Laguna Country and Korean congregations) was needed. This has been completed and is ready for use. We received \$22,000 from the insurance company for this project.

Rise Against Hunger: Because of the generous donations of many members of LCUMC, the goal of raising \$3,280 has been reached. The event where food is packaged, sponsored by five United Methodist churches, will take place Sunday, September 7th, 3:00-5:00 p.m. Sign up for the event is available in the Narthex on Sundays.

Sherman Indian High School Donations: More than fifteen boxes have been filled with items donated by members and friends of LCUMC. We will continue receiving donations until the middle of August.

October 4th Seminar: A one day seminar, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., on the formation of the Old and New Testaments will be held on Saturday, October 4th. Dr. Lee McDonald, a renowned biblical historian will be the speaker. A \$15 registration fee will include lunch. Members of the community and other churches will be invited and members of LCUMC are urged to invite friends to this event.

What's Going On

Gift from Campbell Charitable Trust: A gift of \$68,828.55 has been given to Laguna Country UMC from Wendy and Eugene Campbell who recently passed on. The note accompanying the gift included the following: "They enjoyed coming to church and enjoyed your congregation and the times spent at your church. Although their health limited their attendance, they wanted to leave you with a donation from their charitable trust to further the efforts to spread the word of God."

Library: The Education Committee wishes to re-establish a library for the church and will be using the Conference Room in the church office as the location. A library cart will be used to bring books to Coffee Hour on Sundays. They are looking for two volunteers to help organize the library. Donations of books by individuals will be welcome.

Laguna Woods United Methodist Foundation: An informative letter was recently sent to members of LCUMC regarding the history and work of the Foundation. In addition, the Foundation wishes to inform members that approximately \$3.6 million has been contributed to the Foundation, approximately \$3.5 million has been distributed to LCUMC, and approximately \$4.1 million is managed by the Foundation at this time, including \$2.0 million donated directly to the Foundation and \$2.1 million placed by LCUMC to be managed by the Foundation.

Freedom Village Service: A new member, Rev. Steven Jenkins, is providing a half hour devotional time every Thursday, 10:30 am at Freedom Village Residence.


