# Pastor B.J.'s Reflections




### **Celebrating Our 60th Anniversary**





### Life Lessons

#### October 6th: We're not Waiting for Godot: Isaiah 25:6-9

Samual Beckett's play, "Waiting for Godot", is a response to Friedrich Nietzsche's pronouncement that "God is dead." "Waiting for Godot" suggests that we spend our lives waiting for Godot (God) in our longing to find purpose and meaning in our otherwise absurd existence. When Godot (God) fails to show, we are left with nothing but broken promises and disillusionment. So, is God dead? Are we like Linus, waiting every Halloween for the Great Pumpkin? Isaiah offers a resounding "NO!" and offers an image of God's bounty that fits perfectly on today's World Communion Sunday.

#### October 13th: How to Do the Impossible: Mark 10:17-31

When Jesus talks to the man who fell at his knees asking what he must do to inherit eternal life, Jesus points the man to the decalogue or Ten Commandments. When the man says he has kept the commandments his whole life Jesus looked at him with love and said he lacked one thing: "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me" (Mark 10:21). The man went away sad, for he had many possessions. To the man, Jesus had asked the impossible. Let's face it, we cannot do the impossible alone. Only God can, for whom nothing is impossible. So, we must allow God to work through us. This is our task as followers of Christ.

#### October 20th: To Be Great Is to Serve: Mark 10:35-45

"I want the seat at your right hand," James and John tell Jesus. His response is instructive: "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served" (Mark 10:42-45). Striving to be last is the higher goal; striving to serve is the greatest call. Servanthood is the path of following Christ. If our master came to serve, we also are called to serve.

#### October 27th: Finish The Job: Mark 10:46-52

I was fortunate as a competitive swimmer to have a virtual equal on another team. One meet, I would win the race; the next meet, he would hoist the first-place trophy. Tracy and I pushed each other. Our competition made us train harder and give every ounce of effort we had in the pool. We even sat together at invitationals and genuinely enjoyed each other's company. This is the attitude Paul urges the Corinthians to adopt as he challenges them to continue to grow in the grace of giving: "I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others." (2 Corinthians 8:8).

Greetings LCUMC Members,

It was brought to my attention that there are campus activities generated or related to Trustees that our members may not be familiar with and might affect your activities while on campus. Below are the headliners:

Roof repair and replacement will start Early October. Roofs affected are the Sun Room, Youth Room, Maintenance Office, Narthex Office and Main offices. Thank you the Administrative Committee and Foundation for coming together to get this much needed work done.

Both Jacaranda trees overhanging the main office needed to be removed. As beautiful as they were their prolific foliage drop created serious drainage and deterioration problems for years. At some very considerable expense the Ficklin kitchen and adjacent bathroom pipes were snaked multiple times by two different plumbers. Although the cast iron pipes are very old and worn and will eventually need further costly redress, they have not backed up in several weeks and that is an achievement.

We continue to tour childcare organizations interested in renting the Kids Cove portables. We are hopeful a lucrative contract will be signed sooner than later.

Weight Watchers has expressed interest in renting the Youth Room to meet 4 days a week. Joey has worked hard to store Fickling stage items in there and now removing them for this potential use. Much gratitude and fingers crossed this opportunity pans out for both parties.

The City of Laguna Woods will be modifying the sidewalk that runs across the Moulton driveway of both LCUMC and the synagogue to meet ADA requirements. This will be at their cost. A date has not yet been set.

The Administrative Council has set October 27th as LCUMC's 60th Anniversary celebration! More details to follow in the next couple of weeks. If you are interested in volunteering to help plan for this event, please let Laddie Perez know. It was a heartwarming trip to Sherman Indian High School, Riverside, CA, where we got to meet the new principal, new dorm coordinator, several students who helped unload vehicles, staff, and our treasured contact at Sherman, Lorene Sisquoc. Reminder: Sherman Indian High School is one of only four Boarding Schools that remain under the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Bureau of Indian Education.

So far, Cal-Pac Churches, United Women in Faith groups, individuals, and networks of other organizations have helped us provide over 100 comforters, 150 beach towels, 150 reusable water bottles, countless art supplies, personal items like shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and a host of snacks. On our first trip, we loaded up two SUVs to capacity, plus a full-sized pickup. This also gave us an opportunity to see if there was anything else that might be helpful. While we were there, we learned of a request for socks from a new dorm coordinator, so we recently purchased \$500+ in socks for women and men in a variety of sizes.

We also learned that the school's art teachers recently resigned, so the many art supplies provided will enable the staff to offer after-school & extracurricular activities for the students. Another trip will be needed to deliver additional resources that staff felt would help their new way of offering to students, which will include beach towels and additional art supplies, mainly clay.

Many Thanks! Wados! don't seem enough for the generosity that so many provided to help these students, who come from all over, feel welcomed and cared about. Those we had the opportunity to meet, especially the new principal, were overjoyed and nearly to tears for all this means to the students, especially that it came from caring members of the Church.

Thanks to the generosity of so many, we still have some funds on hand. We are in conversation with Lorene Sisquoc on additional needs, or to possibly do something additional for those students who are not able to go home for Winter Break.


